Project WET is a water focused education program for K-12 educators and their students. Project WET uses a curriculum guide that contains activities to teach about the role water plays in ecosystems and human life. Each activity uses hands-on exercises that encourage teamwork, research, problem solving and critical thinking.

Registration is free, but limited to the first 30 participants. Educators who attend will be certified in Project WET and will leave with a curriculum guide.
